Magnificent Views over the Clee and Malvern Hills. The House dates back to 1730 and was designed by Francis of Warwick. The interior has beautiful plaster work by Francesco Vassalli and an Adam styled dining room. 1 mile north of Cleobury Mortimer on the A4117 and 7 miles west of Bewdley.
