



The Prayer Diary - April to June 2024

The main part of this Prayer Diary covers the quarter from Sunday 24th March to Saturday 22nd June, week by week, under the following headings:

- **Anglican** - A bidding for each day, taken from the Anglican Cycle of Prayer and updated as fully and accurately as possible, so that we can pray with confidence with and for the Anglican Communion worldwide.
- **Hereford** - A bidding for each day, featuring each quarter half of the deaneries and benefices of our diocese, along with diocesan organisations, areas of work, and officers.
- **Porvoo** - This weekly bidding pairs the Lutheran churches of the Nordic and Baltic areas and the Anglican churches of the British Isles and of Spain and Portugal, which have signed the Porvoo Declaration recognising each others' ministries. Also included is the Latvian Church, which has not yet taken a decision on signing the Declaration, and the Church of Denmark, which has not signed but wishes to develop links with the churches which have signed.
- **The Wider View** - Biddings and promptings for prayer relating to world mission and development, including our own World Church links, among them our companion links with the Kirchenkreis Nürnberg in Germany, and the Tanzanian dioceses of Tanga, Dar es Salaam, Masasi and Newala.
- **This Week and Today** - Focuses for prayer during the week, on themes and issues in healthcare, the community, education and the changing seasons, along with events, meetings etc from the Diocesan calendar.
- **Prayer** - A prayer or reflection appropriate to the week.

Please send entries for the next edition which covers the quarter July to September 2024 to me at wkrowell@btinternet.com - clearly marked in the subject area as Prayer Diary. The more I know about events and activities, the more accurate and focused our prayer biddings can be. Please also let me know if you spot any mistakes or omissions - they do happen, alas, but I will always do my best to make sure this Diary is as accurate as possible!

The Wider View	Pray for world peace, for the many nations divided by civil conflict, and for those attacked by others. Pray for those seeking to provide refuge and humanitarian aid to those trapped in war zones or forced to leave land and homes.
This Week	<p>As Holy Week begins, give thanks for the Christ who, in human frailty, walks the road we walk, and pray that in this week we may walk in the way of his suffering, and, by the victory of the cross, may share also in his resurrection. Sunday is also World TB Day. Tuberculosis is a worldwide epidemic, but this year's theme reminds us that it can be beaten. Pray for increased investment, and for co-operation among nations to make this happen.</p> <p>Monday is FND Awareness Day. Functional Neurological Disorder affects the brain network, can happen to anyone at any age, and can be severe and disabling. Access to specialist care, or lack of appropriate care, can be a serious issue in much of the UK. Pray for better awareness and improved provision.</p> <p>Purple Day on Tuesday raises awareness of epilepsy: pray for all who live with this condition, and for their care and support.</p> <p>The Chrism Eucharist on Wednesday prompts prayer for all who exercise ministry in our parishes, and for our commitment as parish churches to be a serving and healing presence in the communities in which we are set.</p> <p>Wednesday is also World Theatre Day, emphasising the importance of this art form, which can challenge and inform as well as entertain. Pray for the provision and resourcing of theatre within our communities, and give thanks for the Hereford Passion earlier this month, in which the story of this week was vividly told anew.</p> <p>On Maundy Thursday give thanks for the saving love of Christ expressed in the breaking of bread and sharing of wine, and pray that we may be ready to serve one another and be servants to the world, as he has served us. Pray for the many events and worship activities of Good Friday around our Diocese, and especially for those that bring different churches together, and are a public witness to our faith and our Lord.</p> <p>On Saturday, Easter Eve, pray for all who feel the pain of bereavement and loss, and for the care we offer to the newly bereaved.</p> <p>Saturday is also World Bipolar Day. Pray for greater awareness of bipolar disorders, that social stigma and discrimination may be removed.</p>

The Wider View <i>Nürnberg</i>	Please pray for Bishop Elisabeth and all our partners in the Nuremberg Episcopal Area of the Lutheran Church of Bavaria, as they face the challenge of falling revenues in this post-Covid time, and are having to re-organise parishes and cut posts. We pray especially for the parish of Langwasser, twinned with St Laurence's Church, Ludlow, who face a long vacancy following the retirement of Pastor Jörg Gunsenheimer.
This Week	<p>Pray on Easter Day that the glory of the Resurrection may touch our hearts afresh, reminding us that with God nothing is impossible or without hope, and inspiring us to praise and service.</p> <p>On All Fools' Day, Monday, may we be reminded that the foolishness of God is wiser than all human wisdom, and be ready, like Paul, to know nothing but Christ, and him crucified.</p> <p>Tuesday is World Autism Acceptance Day, raising awareness of the barriers and discrimination that many who live with autism still experience. Pray for better understanding, and for guidance and support.</p> <p>April is kept as Stress Awareness Month: Stress continues to be a significant public health challenge, and the month has sought to open a dialogue and to create safe space for people to talk about the impact stress creates in their professional and personal lives. Pray we may be challenged to see what we can do to make things better, and be agents of positive change.</p> <p>This is also Parkinson's Awareness Month, educating people on the many symptoms that impact daily life, and how to recognize the early signs that can lead to an earlier Parkinson's diagnosis and a better quality of life. Pray for all who live with this disabling disease, and for their families and friends.</p> <p>International Children's Book Day, on Tuesday (the birth day of Hans Christian Andersen) celebrates children's books, and aims to inspire a love of reading in the young. Pray for all who encourage children to read, at school and at home, for the proper funding and resourcing of library services, and for all who write for children.</p> <p>Pray for rambling and walking groups within our communities, and for all who lead walks. Pray too for volunteers who care for footpaths and stiles.</p> <p>Pray for all who work in the hospitality and tourism sector within our communities, as the Easter holiday begins the new season.</p> <p>Pray for visitors to our churches at Easter and through the Bank Holiday week, and that they may feel welcomed, affirmed and refreshed.</p>

The Wider View <i>Tanzania</i>	Sporadic measles outbreaks in various of Tanzania since 2022 have led to an intensive national vaccination campaign targeting children between ages of one and four years, supported by the WHO. Some eight million children have received vaccination, but there is still mistrust of vaccination in some areas. Pray that all children may receive the healthcare and protection they need.
This Week	<p>The Second Sunday of Easter is known as Low Sunday, perhaps as a simple contrast with Easter Day itself as the high day of the Christian year, but perhaps also from the Latin laudes, "Let us praise". May our Easter praise resonate in all we are and do.</p> <p>Sunday is also World Health Day, which this year has the theme "My health, my right," chosen to champion the right of people everywhere to access quality health services, education, and information, and to have safe drinking water, clean air, good nutrition and good housing and working conditions. Pray for the many millions in our world who do not have access to essential healthcare.</p> <p>On the (transferred) feast of the Annunciation (Monday), pray for the work and witness of the Mothers' Union here and around the world.</p> <p>Tuesday commemorates Dietrich Bonhoeffer, whose opposition to the Nazi regime prompts prayer for all those whose faith leads them to stand against oppression and discrimination, and in support of those who are marginalised, often at great personal risk or cost.</p> <p>Pray for all who are receiving treatment for bowel cancer, and for all who are working to combat this disease. Bowel Cancer UK's "Active for April" campaign this month aims to raise both funds and awareness. Pray for campaigns and information to help ensure awareness and early diagnosis.</p> <p>William Law, remembered on Wednesday, was unable to swear allegiance to King George I, and therefore lost his position at Emmanuel College, Cambridge. His spiritual writings, especially 'A Serious Call to a Devout and Holy Life' greatly influenced the leaders of the great Evangelical Revival of the 18th Century. He emphasised thankfulness to God as the basis from which all our Christian work and witness should spring - pray for that spirit of thankfulness within every part of our Church today.</p> <p>Our schools start their summer term this week. Pray for all who teach and all who learn, and especially for those who will be studying now for important exams.</p> <p>Pray for all who teach and translate the scriptures, and especially for the work of bringing the Bible to young eyes and ears in creative ways.</p>

The Wider View <i>Nürnberg</i>	We pray for the Wilhelm-Löhe-Schule and the Hans Sachs Gymnasium in Nuremberg and their many contacts, past and present, with schools in our Diocese; and for the growing number of schools which are linked through Coventry's International Cross of Nails (ICON) fellowship.
This Week	<p>Monday is Microvolunteering Day, which seeks to encourage those who are hesitant about big commitments to see that there are still good and useful things they can do. Microvolunteering is described as “bite-sized, on-demand, no commitment actions that benefit a worthy cause.” Pray for all who do give of their time and ability to help others or make a difference within their community.</p> <p>Tuesday is World Voice Day, dedicated to the power of the human voice, but also raising awareness of vocal problems and issues. Pray we may use the power of speech with care and consideration.</p> <p>Wednesday is World Haemophilia Day. Pray for a better awareness of haemophilia, von Willebrand disease and other inherited bleeding disorders. Increased awareness leads to better diagnosis; pray also for the millions who remain without access to care and treatment.</p> <p>Friday is national Early Years Teacher Day. Give thanks for nursery provision in our schools, and for all who teach reception children. Those who take responsibility for a child's very first years in education play a vital role in forming an eagerness to learn.</p> <p>Alphege, remembered on Friday, was a hermit, then Abbot of Bath, before his humility and piety led to his being made Bishop of Winchester and then Archbishop of Canterbury. As Archbishop he was captured by Danish invaders and held to ransom. He refused to allow a ransom to be paid for his life, and so was killed (on 19th April, 1012) by his captors, in an act of drunken rage.</p> <p>Pray for those who provide and maintain sports facilities in our towns and villages, and especially for those who teach and coach young people, and encourage them in looking after their own fitness and learning new skills.</p> <p>Pray for those who care for our village and community halls, all of them very dependant on the time and skills offered by volunteers. Pray also for the regular users of these facilities.</p> <p>Pray for sheep farming families as the lambing season draws towards its close, a time of shared stress and hard work, and of immense highs and lows.</p>

It affirms that all have a contribution to make, and rejects the idea that people seeking safety should have to ‘prove their worth’ more than others in society.</p> <p>Sunday is the last day of this year’s Loneliness Awareness Week.
